# MILBANK MEMORIAL FUND

## Travel Procedures

### General

The Fund either pays directly or reimburses travel expenses incurred in connection with its work. All travel must be economy class at the lowest rate available to the Fund's travel agent unless other arrangements are approved by the Fund prior to ticketing. Persons who decide to use their own travel agent will be reimbursed at the lowest rate available to the Fund's agent. Other allowable expenses include hotel, meals, gratuities, mileage for use of personal car, parking fees, tolls, taxis and other public conveyance. **The Fund does not reimburse such personal incidental expenses as telephone calls, Internet connections, faxes, liquor tabs, laundry/dry cleaning and, normally, room service.** Car rentals and the use of car service must be approved by the Fund in advance.

### Airline and Train Reservations

The Fund has selected Ultramar Travel in New York as its travel agency. A representative of Ultramar can provide information about airline and train schedules and confirm space availability. An agent will book the flight most convenient to you at the lowest economy fare available. Most airlines now issue e-tickets. If you prefer a paper ticket, the airline will charge you a service fee of \$20 to \$50. Ultramar Travel is located at 14 East 47<sup>th</sup> Street, 5th Floor, New York, NY 10017-1905. The telephone number is 800-532-4041 or 201-291-8801 (Monday to Friday 8:30 a.m.-6:30 p.m.) and 800-297-1783 (after hours).

### Nonrefundable Change Policy

Economy class travel at the lowest rate is sometimes nonrefundable. Fees for changes to nonrefundable tickets vary with each airline and the fare paid. Most airlines charge \$100, and a few \$25, plus the difference in the cost of the ticket should the fare go up. **You are normally responsible for any fees incurred and the additional cost of the ticket.** If a nonrefundable reservation is canceled, you have one year to reuse the ticket towards another nonrefundable reservation for a trip to a meeting sponsored by the Fund. If the reservation needs to be canceled, it must be done prior to the original date of travel.

### Refunds

For all cancellations, please call Ultramar Travel as soon as possible. If an e-ticket was issued, Ultramar will refund our account when you call. If a train ticket was issued, please return the unused ticket (whole or partial) to Ultramar Travel. A refund can be made only if the actual ticket is turned in.

### Hotel Reservations

Travelers to New York on Fund business will usually stay at the Affinia 50 Hotel, 155 East 50th Street (at Third Avenue), telephone 212-751-5710. The Affinia 50 Hotel will bill the Fund directly at a special rate for room charges excluding incidentals. Reservations can be made by contacting Ms. Gail Cambridge, the Fund's administrative services manager, at 212-355-8400. Reservations for hotels in other cities must be made through the Fund.

### Reimbursement Procedures

Receipts must accompany all requests for reimbursement of expenses. At the completion of a trip, travelers must submit a completed travel reimbursement form (see attached form) with original receipts attached.

answered

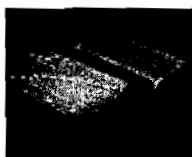
- 2. Identify relevant evidence that can be used to answer questions and make well-informed clinical decisions

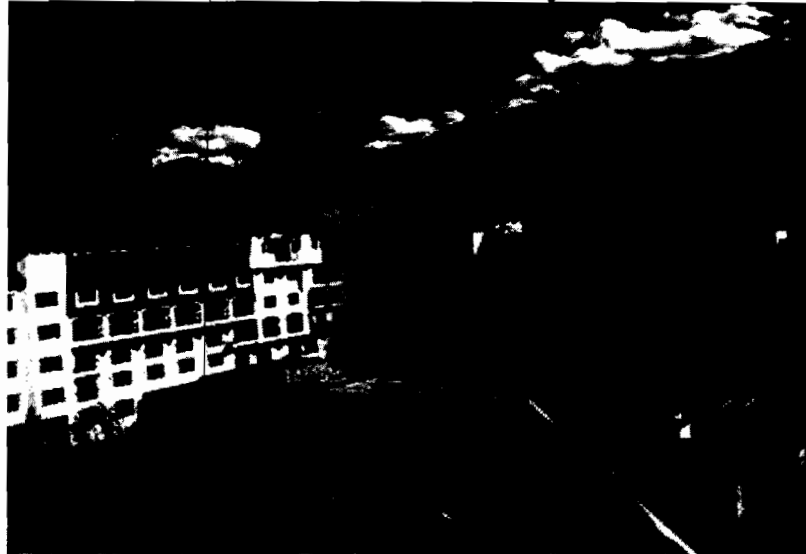

I was delighted to get your voice message that you can and will attend this year's Rocky Mountain Workshop on Evidence- Based Health Care. The Workshop is run by the University of Colorado School of Medicine and their Health Sciences Center. In addition it receives support from the federal Agency for Health Care Research and Quality and the Milbank Memorial Fund.
