Ms. Susan Crosby currently serves as the President of Women In Government. She had served as the Deputy Executive Director of the organization since 2002 and previously as Chair of the Board of Directors. Ms. Crosby served in the Indiana House of Representatives for 12 years prior to joining Women In Government. She was the first woman elected to the Indiana House from District 44. During her tenure in the House of Representatives, Ms. Crosby served for six years as the first woman Deputy Speaker Pro Tempore and Vice Chair of the Rules and Legislative Procedures Committee.

Senator Connie Lawson currently represents the 24th District in the Indiana State Senate. She was first elected in 1996 and serves on the Health and Provider Services and Rules Committees. She is chair of Joint Rules and the Local Government and Elections Committee. She serves as Chair of Indiana Commission on Mental Health on the odd numbered years, she is on the Indiana Advisory Committee to the Office of Women's Health, and is a past Chair of the Indiana Women's Bipartisan Caucus. She has received numerous Awards for her work on mental health from the Indiana Mental Health Association and was recently recognized as Honorary Governor of the Richard Lugar Leadership Series. She was also recently selected to be the first woman in Indiana history to serve as the Majority Floor Leader. Senator Lawson will be the Chair of Women In Government's 2007 Board of Directors.
