Cheryl King serves as the Study Director for the National Commission on Adult Literacy, a 25-member body representing business, education, and government whose purpose is to advocate change and improve adult education and literacy services in America. Previously, King held various positions in Kentucky state government including Commissioner, Kentucky Adult Education; and Deputy Secretary, Cabinet for Workforce Development. While Vice President, Kentucky Adult Education, with the Council on Postsecondary Education, she led Kentucky's adult education system through a strategic reorganization effort that resulted in increased enrollment and GED completions and more adults transitioning to postsecondary education.
