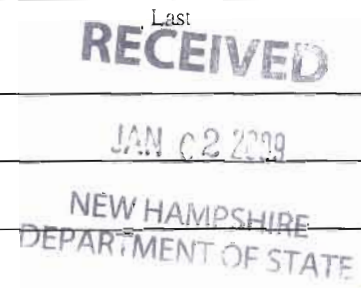

## Connecting State Legislators to Critical Federal Issues

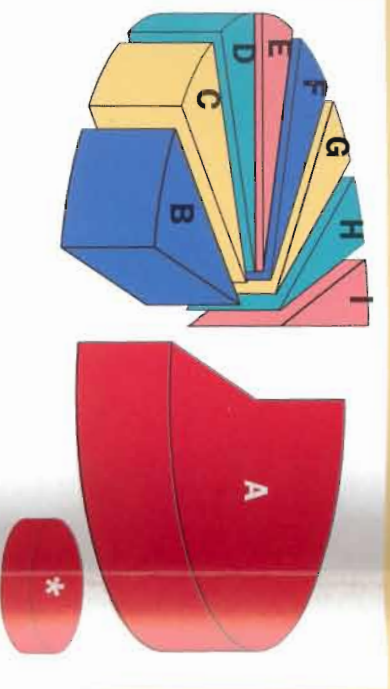
As state legislators, we understand that the federal budget shapes our lives every day. With this knowledge, we can effectively represent our constituents — at home and in Washington.
