REQUESTED ACTION

Authorize the Department of Health and Human Services, Division of Community Based Care Services, Bureau of Drug & Alcohol Services, to extend the agreements with the attached list of providers from July 1, 2013 through December 31, 2014 and increasing the price limitations by \$3,006,961.00 from \$6,515,492.00 to \$9,522,453.00. In addition, request the ability to continue to add to the provider list as applicants respond to the Department's Request for Applications. This request was originally approved through June 30, 2013 by Governor and Executive Council on April 13, 2011 item # 82. Funds are available in the following accounts for State Fiscal Year 2011, 2012, and 2013, and are anticipated to be available for State Fiscal Year 2014 and 2015, upon the availability and continued appropriations of funds in the future operating budgets.

EXPLANATION

Funds in this agreement will be used to further support the Access to Recovery (ATR) initiative, which provides substance abuse treatment services to targeted residents of the State. New Hampshire was one of 30 organizations to receive funding by Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA) for an Access to Recovery program. Initially, the program targeted three underserved populations; prisoners re-entering communities, multiple driving while impaired offenders and veterans returning from military service in Iraq and Afghanistan. In addition, an electronic voucher management system was developed to facilitate service access for this fee-for-service approach and enhance client choice and portability of care.

The purpose of this Request is to seek approval to extend the agreements with the attached list of providers from July 1, 2013 to December 31, 2014 and increase the price limitations by \$3,006,961.00 from \$6,515,492.00 to \$9,522,453.00. In addition, we request the ability to continue to add to the provider list as applicants respond to the Department's Request for Application. These requested revisions have been reviewed and approved by the federal Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration Grants Management office.

The Request for Applications (RFA) soliciting qualified treatment and recovery support providers was posted to the Department's website on March 25, 2011 and will remain posted through June 30, 2014 for on-going solicitation of new providers. Two of the requirements of the Access to Recovery program are to expand the number of available service providers and to expand the client options and choices relative to these services. The addition of providers will foster a more competitive environment for provision of quality services statewide. The Bureau has attained a wide base of providers in the central and southern regions of the State and will begin actively pursuing providers in the western region and North Country over the next fiscal year. All providers will be paid per established rates as attached. The Bureau will maintain a list of providers including status of licensing, insurance, and similar requirements necessary to remain qualified to provide the Access to Recovery services.

The NH Administrative Rule He-A 400 was revised effective April 3, 2012 to allow for all NH citizens convicted of a Driving While Impaired offense to qualify for Access to Recovery services, subject to income limitations. In addition, with the passage of HB 283, effective January 1, 2013 Access to Recovery services will be offered to those completing the Impaired Driver Education Programs. Statistics have shown a direct correlation between those obtaining treatment services early in the cycle and a reduction in recidivism, the sooner clients are identified and provided treatment the more successful the treatment.

Effective July 1, 2012 all agencies providing substance abuse treatment services under contract with the Bureau are required to develop the capacity for group recovery support services for a minimum of 50% of the number of clients (including outpatient clients) the agency is under contract to serve. The group recovery support services will be funded through the Access to Recovery grant. In addition, each treatment provider will be paid a Recovery Outcome Incentive of \$100 for each client which they provided Access to Recovery supported group aftercare services, if

- a. The client has participated in a minimum of 32 units (typically about 8 one hour sessions) of group aftercare services, and
- b. Has remained abstinent from alcohol and drugs within the past 30 days, at or around 5 months following admission to the Access to Recovery program.

One year into the program agencies were surveyed to identify barriers in the utilization of Access to Recovery services. One of the primary concerns of the agencies was the low unit reimbursement for certain services. In an effort to meet program goals, service rates were increased for Care Coordination, group counseling and individual recovery support.

Client incentives to complete the program and transportation services were also added to the rate structure. These items were included in the Bureau's original grant request and were recommended by the federal Grants Management Office. Transportation into additional regions and communities within the State will be added during the upcoming fiscal year. Transportation pricing and services offered within communities may vary slightly and may result in similar but not identical service rates as the capacity and cost for these services vary by geographical region. An updated Access to Recovery Service Rate Chart is attached.

Should Governor and Executive Council determine to not authorize this Request; the enrollment of clientele in remote sections of the State will be significantly hampered due to lack of available providers and the ability of the Bureau to fund quality treatment services due to the loss of federal funds for failure to meet the stated goals.

Area served: statewide.

Source of Funds is 100% Federal Funds from the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administrations (SAMHSA).



EXPLANATION

The purpose of this Request is to seek approval to enter into agreements with providers on the attached list. They represent a variety of substance abuse treatment and recovery support agencies, to provide services under the New Hampshire Access to Recovery Program. The list includes current approved providers under He-A 400 Rules for the New Hampshire Access to Recovery Program, such as treatment providers and Community Mental Health and Community Health centers. Services include, but are not limited to outpatient counseling, intensive outpatient counseling and peer recovery support.

Additionally, the purpose of this Request is to seek approval to add providers to the attached list as they are approved under the Provider Application Procedure in He-A 400. Two of the requirements of the New Hampshire Access to Recovery Program are to expand the number of available service providers and to expand client options and choice relative to these services. The addition of providers will foster a more competitive environment for provision of quality services. All providers will be paid per established rates as attached. The Bureau of Drug & Alcohol Services will maintain the list of providers including the status of licensing or similar requirements necessary to remain on the list.

New Hampshire residents in need of substance abuse treatment will directly benefit by approval of this Request and the enrollment of treatment providers to follow. Three underserved populations will be served during the first two years of the New Hampshire Access to Recovery Program to include: 1) prisoners re-entering communities from state correctional facilities, 2) multiple driving while intoxicated offenders meeting established income eligibility guidelines, and 3) veterans returning from military service in Iraq and Afghanistan. It is anticipated that the federal grant funding these services may be used to serve additional segments of the population in the third and fourth years. Fully operational, this project will serve an average of 1,100 adults per year seeking long-term recovery from substance use disorders by expanding outpatient treatment, and intensive outpatient treatment services and adding recovery support services including peer recovery coaching, and potentially ancillary services such as transportation and child care.

New Hampshire was one of 30 states to receive funding by the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA), Access to Recovery Project. The New Hampshire Access to Recovery Initiative will reduce alcohol and other drug abuse and dependence among New Hampshire adults by providing client-centered care to individuals with substance use disorders as defined by the Diagnostic and Statistical Manual (DSM) IV. The goals of the Initiative are to increase the number of individuals accessing treatment and recovery support services and increase the number of individuals in long-term recovery by expanding New Hampshire's service capacity to meet the individual needs of clients through effective case management, client choice of service providers and reduced barriers to care.

In anticipation of a growing number of service providers, an electronic voucher management system to facilitate service access and track and account for vendor payments has been developed for the New Hampshire Access to Recovery Initiative to institute a fee-for-service approach and provide client choice of approved enrolled service providers. This electronic voucher management system was approved by Governor and Council on January 19, 2011, Item #65.

Should Governor and Executive Council determine to not authorize this Request, the enrollment of as many as one-hundred or more new providers, many of whom may be providing relatively few services to a small number of clients at any given time, will be an extremely inefficient and unwieldy process requiring the development of individual contracts, each requiring Governor and Executive approval. Additionally, failure to develop an adequate network of new providers would most likely result in termination of the federal Access to Recovery grant award and the loss of services to approximately 4500 individuals in need of substance abuse treatment.

The Request For Applications (RFA) was posted on the Department of Health and Human Services website on March 25, 2011 through April 15, 2011 and will be posted indefinitely on the Bureau of Drug & Alcohol Services website for ongoing solicitation of new providers. In addition, notice was sent to providers and agencies within the treatment and recovery community notifying them of the RFA.


