REQUESTED ACTION

The Department of Cultural Resources, Division of the Arts, requests permission to renew our membership with the National Assembly of State Arts Agencies (NASAA), Washington, DC (Vendor code 171911). Annual membership dues are \$16,000.00. Federal funds are available in 01-34-34-341010-1255-026-5002510

EXPLANATION

The Division of the Arts will be continuing its membership with the National Assembly of State Arts Agencies, which works at the national, state and local levels to ensure that the arts play a valued role in the educational, economic and cultural well-being of our communities.

This membership allows the Division of the Arts to access uniquely specialized knowledge and staff time from NASAA.

In response to the questions from the Councilors

1. **How long has this organization been in existence and how long has this agency been a member of this organization?**
NASAA was founded in 1968 and incorporated in 1974. The New Hampshire Commission on the Arts was a member at the time of NASAA's initial formation in 1968, and has remained so since that time.
2. **Is there any other organization which provides the same or similar benefits which your agency belongs to?**
No
3. **How many other state's belonging to this organization and is your agency the sole New Hampshire state agency that is a member?**
All 56 state and US jurisdictions and 6 regional state arts organizations belong. We are the only state agency that is a member.
4. **How is the dues structure established?**
Members pay on a sliding scale based on budget size, makes the services and benefits affordable for all.

5. **What benefit does the state receive from participating in this membership?**
NASAA is the only organization dedicated exclusively to state arts agencies and their needs. Everything NASAA does is designed to help state arts agencies and maximize their value to the public and to state government. By participating in NASAA, state arts agencies increase their knowledge, secure resources and gain strength through a national community.

6. **Are training or educational/ research materials included in the membership? If so, is the cost included? Explain in detail.**

Yes- Data on state arts agency budgets, rankings, staffing and structure; Detailed information on state arts agency grants; customized reports; examples of programs and guidelines; analysis of state arts agency policy issues; referrals to states facing similar situations; advice on strategic planning, needs assessment and program evaluation methods; examples of best practices and innovative programs; web seminars exploring current trends and new research; connections to experts and ideas from outside the state arts agency field. They also provide opportunities for our constituency to participate in on-line webinars at no cost.

7. **Is the membership required to receive any federal grants or required in order to receive or participate in licensing or certification exams?**

Membership is not required to receive federal grants

8. **Is there any travel included with this membership fee? Explain in detail any travel to include the number of employees involved, the number of trips, destination if known and purposes of membership supported trips.**

Yes, leadership training is scheduled two administrative staff every two years. These are held throughout the country in conjunction with the annual conference. The next training is scheduled for Wyoming


9. **Which state agency employees are directly involved with this organization? Indicate if they are members, voting members, committee members, and/or officers of the organization.**
