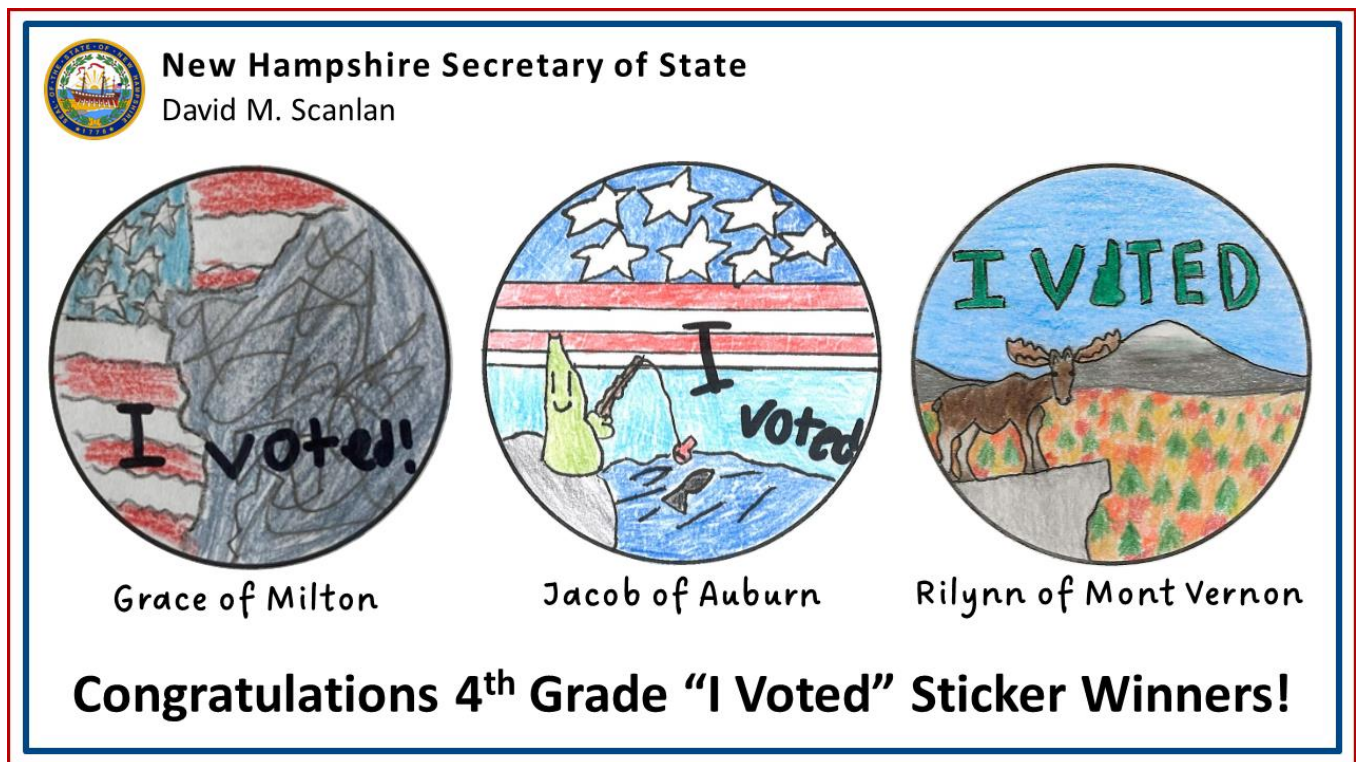

New Hampshire Secretary of State and Deputy Secretary of State Announce Winners of the “I Voted” Sticker Contest

Over 1,000 fourth grade students across the state submitted sticker designs.

CONCORD, NH (October 24, 2023): New Hampshire Secretary of State David M. Scanlan and Deputy Secretary of State Erin T. Hennessey are pleased to announce the three winners of the first-ever “I Voted” Sticker Contest!

Of the over 1,000 designs submitted by fourth graders from around the state of NH, Grace of Milton, Jacob of Auburn, and Rilynn of Mont Vernon were chosen as the winners by local town and city clerks during their annual conference in October. Each design captures the spirit of New Hampshire and encourages all voters to take part in NH elections.



The winning designs will be printed as “I Voted” stickers and distributed during the 2024 New Hampshire Presidential Primary. Grace, Jacob, and Rilynn will also be invited to the State House to have lunch with Secretary Scanlan and Deputy Secretary Hennessey.
