REQUESTED ACTION

That approval be and hereby is given to the Attorney General to appoint Jon-Daniel Lavallee to Position 9U697 (Appropriation No. 02-20-200510-2620-013-500117) as an Assistant Attorney General, at a salary level of \$86,000, effective upon Governor and Executive Council approval or November 18, 2022, whichever is later.

EXPLANATION

Mr. Lavallee is a resident of Henniker. He received his law degree from the University of Colorado Law School in May 2013. From January through June 2014, Mr. Lavallee worked as an energy policy intern at the New Hampshire Nature Conservancy. He was commissioned as an officer United States Coast Guard in July 2014 and served on active duty until September 2018. Mr. Lavallee joined the Department of Justice in December 2018 and served in both the Civil Bureau's Client Counseling Unit and the Criminal Justice Bureau's Environmental Protection Bureau. He was appointed as an Assistant Attorney General in December 2019. Mr. Lavallee currently holds the rank of Lieutenant Commander in the United States Coast Guard Reserves. He was called-up for extended active duty in the Coast Guard from October 2021 to November 2022. In accordance with the Uniformed Services Employment and Reemployment Rights Act, 38 U.S.C. §§4301-4335, and New Hampshire's policy of support for the National Guard and Reserves, Mr. Lavallee will be welcomed back to the Department and assigned to the Client Counseling Unit at an annual salary of \$86,000.
