New Hampshire Secretary of State Predicts Voter Turnout for Midterm Election

CONCORD, NH (November 4, 2022) Secretary of State David Scanlan predicts 591,000 voters will turn out to vote in next Tuesday's Midterm Election. This will represent a record turnout surpassing the previous record for a midterm election set in 2018.

"We have several hotly contested races at the top of the ballot, and this is generating a lot of enthusiasm among voters to participate in the election," Scanlan said.

As of Thursday, there were 883,035 registered voters, including 278,681 Democrats, 276,034 Republicans and 328,320 Undeclared voters.

This year, New Hampshire went through the statutorily required 10-year checklist verification (RSA 654:39) where voters who had been inactive for two full election cycles (4 years) were removed from the checklist. As a result, a large number of election-day voter registrations should be expected.
